Participants will get tested at a lab closest to them. Lab results with an explanation will be sent via mail and linkage to care and vaccination will be done for those in need. All costs are covered for the testing as well as a small incentive for the cost of travel to participants. 

# National Nurse Led Care Consortium - PHMC

- Program Highlight **HIV/HCV Testing Program**:
  - 2012 NNCC was awarded a CDC grant to build hepatitis C virus (HCV) programming in five community health centers in Philadelphia. We continued directly working with the PHMC health centers to sustain increased HCV screening and treatment programs through 2017.
  - 2018 build on our partnership with the health centers to support opioid use disorder and viral hepatitis outreach and education programming for vulnerable and underserved members of our community.
  - 2018 <u>AmeriCorps State Program</u>, focused on opioid outreach and education to combat the rise in opioid use disorder, decrease transmission of infectious diseases, and expand awareness of treatment options.
  - O 2019 partnership with the Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH) to monitor and increase availability of hepatitis B virus (HBV) screening, testing, vaccination, and treatment in the PHMC health centers. This partnership will also support provider education by partnering with Hep B Foundation to promote increased capacity to treat HBV positive patients
